Solar Energy

It has come to her attention through Andrew Tickle at EMEC that the school and the
municipality are two different entities and cannot be combined. Sundog says it is not
feasible to continue. Jane attended a School Board Meeting to share her findings.
School Board Member Marty Richard knows the CEO at the Electric Company, Mr.
Hallowell and will see if there is a way to combine the two entities. The Solar Energy
Project is shelved for the moment.

Cemetery

- Mowing discussion of putting out a bid for the next fiscal year as requested at the summer Town Meeting last summer.
- Does Foster Carlow wish to mow the cemetery for the end of this fiscal year, Foster said,
 No.
- An update on the activities was given. Very successful, lots helpers from age 5 to 80.
 Much trash was taken on both days, brush was cut and areas were raked. The group will have another work day on May 8th.
- Rhonda reported that she felt a budget should be presented in a line item list format.
 She would like to know if the account is a roll over account or if it goes to 0 at the first of every fiscal year. David Davis commented he thought it should be a rollover account so that funds could be built up for major repairs. No Action Taken

- The Assesors asked for an abatement on Val Rousell and David Davis's Properties. Val has been incorrectly taxed on a well that he does not own, he shares a spring with David. Both property cards will be corrected. Val will be abated for the well and share the value of the spring.

- Chad Arndt Property, and abatement of \$1,335.13 for not having his land taxed as tree
 growth. (never charged as tree growth) Chad would like to take a portion of this land out
 of tree growth to place a building on it. The fine for that would be \$5,900.00, which
 would not be cost effective for him. Since it was never charged tree growth there should
 be no fine, or abatement.

- There has been a combative abusive customer in the office, refusing to wear a mask.
 Swearing, throwing a mask and papers at the clerk. Deputy Clerk Dana Porter was on the phone and heard the entire confrontation. Kristy reported that Foster did go talk to the person. Foster told her she should not bring this up in the meeting as it could make things worse. Which made Kristy feel that this scared her more.
 - Dana Porter said it was abusive and scary and uncalled for and made her nervous for Kristy's safety. She then reported it to James Gibson Jr.
 - o David Davis said we can't tolerate this.
 - Rhonda asked where are our security cameras, this is a time that it would be good to have them and to have posted the office is under surveillance to curtail these kinds of activities
 - Kevin Dean asked if Kristy and Dana feel comfortable talking with the police. He
 will contact the police and have them come on Tuesday.

Pokey Lake/Kevin Dean

School Board

Roads/Larry Hill

Larry reported that the town is responsible for ALL town road signs even those on State Roads. Larry also reported that he has estimates for the upcoming fiscal year

Spearin Road (hot top) \$ 70,455.00
 Arm Road (hot top) \$ 83,631.00
 Ditching All Roads \$ 10,000.00
 Salt/Sand (some left over) \$ 20,000.00
 Plowing \$ 110,000.00
 Municipal Plowing \$ 8,000.00

Recommendation: Don't hot top the Arm Road this year, just prepare for hot top. Concerns brought up by others, culvert issues on the Spearin Road/Crawford Road, continuing to bring up the Crawford end of the Arm Road to eventually/possibly hot top.
